We know that their food was extremely popular and they received many excellent reviews during their few months with us.

We thank them for their time and effort, and look forward to announcing a new franchisee as soon as possible.

In addition, you may have noticed that Nick Brown is also no longer manager of The Dog Inn: he left us in October, again due to personal reasons, and to concentrate on the Sir Charles Napier, another Communityowned pub in Blackburn, Since Nick left, Craig Steele (pictured left) has admirably stepped into the breach, on a parttime basis. We are currently assessing the need, or otherwise, of employing a manager.



# Fulfilling more of our aims...

In the last couple of months we have taken a few small steps to fulfilling more of our aims. Firstly, we have set up a Bridge Club, which meets every Wednesday evening at 8pm.

Anyone is welcome to join, from absolute beginners to more experienced players. A Bridge Club was one of the activities first listed as something people would be interested in when we started with steering groups about 3 years ago - before we had even bought the pub!

Secondly, a group of girls have set up their own drama club, and they performed their



very first show just before Christmas (see pg 3). The club is run by, and for, children in the village, with a token adult on the premises just to ensure "crowd control"! It is open to anyone from Year 5 upwards, and although is currently all girls, boys would be most welcome. The group wrote their own panto, and are looking to do another production just before the summer holidays.

They currently meet every Monday, 4.00 - 5.00, upstairs in the Community Room, and attendance is free, although regular attendance is expected wherever possible.

We are still looking at activities for teenage boys, and also for the younger members of our adult community – those between 18 and 30 – who are perhaps less into bridge, karaoke, or drama! If you have any ideas about activities / clubs / events for this age group we would appreciate the input.

# **A New Collaboration**

We are pleased to announce a couple of joint ventures with the Civic Arts Centre, Oswaldtwistle. Like the Dog Inn, the Civic Arts Centre is Community-run, and they have offered to come to the Dog Inn to put on some events.

The first is a World Book Day celebration in the form of a Gruffalo-themed party for younger children. This will take place on Sunday 25th February, from 3 – 5pm in the Community Room upstairs at the Dog Inn. 
