






### **SHOPPING LOCAL**

# ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGE POINTS



We have begun work with the company ChargeMyStreet, to install two electric vehicle charge points on the car park at the back of the pub.

These will be available for customers and village residents to use while parked on the pub car park.

Once these spaces are available, we would kindly

request that village residents try to only use them outside of pub opening hours, so that the charging facilities are available for customers to use while they are in the pub.

We hope that this will help as we all look to become more sustainable in the future.

## ECO-LUTION &

We are planning on creating an Eco-group, where people can meet to discuss ideas for environmentally-sustainable living.

This might be swapping ideas on how to reduce the amount of plastic we use, or setting up a rota to go to the refill shop in Darwen to reduce car miles. There may be the option to do some growing of vegetables etc in plots on the field at the back of the pub, or to do group litter-picks through the village.
