We have recently had some very successful grant applications, financially the pub is doing very well and we have a whole host of wonderful things to look forward to in the coming months.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGE POINTS



Two charge points were installed on our car park last year. Available for customers and village residents to us, we do kindly request that residents try to only use them outside of opening hours, so the facilities are available for customers.

'Charge My Street' have given us an update on the usage of out electric vehicle (EV) charge point. Since Dec 1st to April 2nd there has been:

93 sessions / 1051.98kWh provided, giving an average 7.4kWh per day. A very large Norwegian operator suggests sites need to aim for 5kWh a day. The site has saved 9.77 tonnes of CO2 emissions since being installed.

PROTECT **BELTHORN / GUIDE GREENBEL**

Blackburn & Darwen Council are attempting to release 94 acres of greenbelt land in Belthorn / Guide to develop as an industrial site.

This land is moorland containing peat and is home to an abundance of wildlife and ground nesting birds including lapwings (red listed at risk of extinction), curlew, oyster catchers, snipe, heron, owls, stoats, hare, deer and more.

Once this moorland is destroyed it cannot be replaced, its loss will have a massive impact on future generations.

Over 300 objections have been raised by the local community and the Council have refused to alter their plans despite the

strong feeling of local people against this development.
