Kate has now taken the reins as restaurant manager and we're sure she will settle in well. A few words from the Chair

The Dog Inn finished 2023 on a high - record monthly takings in December topping off record annual takings since the pub came into community ownership in 2015. We organised more community events and activities than we have ever done before - and we are very grateful to the people of Belthorn for supporting these community events time after time. We have signed a new contract with lamie Evans, now as an independent operator, to continue running our popular restaurant.

We also made significant investment in the building itself to secure its future for the



long term. We replaced the westward facing roof which was in a sorry state of repair - and embedded solar panels in the repaired roof to reduce our energy bills for the next 25 years.

We also repainted the pub and re-rendered the rear wall - thanks to Alex Sunter for his work on this. We also replaced the roof over the ladies toilet - again thanks to Paul Allen for his work on this.

We are planning 2024 in a spirit of optimism, we have a bumper programme of events planned for the next few months.

My thanks to the committee, the staff and all our volunteers for their hard work in making The Dog Inn a real community pub.

COMMUNITY GARDENS ARE GROWING



Over the winter a small group of volunteers have been working on the Community Gardens on the field at the back of the pub.

3 raised beds / planters have been created, and although these still need to be filled with compost and soil, they will provide great opportunities for growing produce both for

the restaurant and for people in the village to use. Some fruit trees and daffodil bulbs have also been planted, along with some willow trees. If anyone would like the opportunity to use the raised beds, please contact admin@thedoginnatbelthorn.net to

express an interest - these will be issued on a first-come, first served basis, and will be available for a nominal annual fee. We will also be looking for extra volunteers to help maintain the garden areas, also to erect a shed that we have acquired, and possibly a greenhouse in the future. In addition, we could use some compost bins and water butts if anyone has any spare!

Whilst working on the field, it has been noticed that quite a lot of dog mess is being left in this area. Whilst the management of the pub are happy for villagers to use the field with their dogs, this is on condition that all dog mess is cleared up by dog owners. Failure to clear up after dogs may result in access to the field being restricted.
